

PreK3 and PreK4 Summer Reading

In order to help instill a love of reading in your child and ensure they are prepared for school, we encourage you to read with your child daily. As often as possible, allow your child to participate in choosing the books you read and engage with them as you read out loud together. Invite them to comment on what they see in the pictures, ask them what they think about the characters or events, and talk about what you are reading. While there is no official summer assignment for preK3 or preK4 students, we also encourage you to review letters, numbers, and sounds. The web site www.starfall.com is a good resource and we encourage you to visit this site with your child a few times each week to review the helpful content found there.

For PreK4 students: We ask you to keep a log of books you and your child read during the summer. In order to help you accomplish this task, you might consider a summer reading program for your family to participate in together. You might find one your child enjoys at your local public library, Barnes and Noble, Half Price Books, Chipotle, Scholastic Reading Program online, Chuck E. Cheese, or HEB. It will be exciting for your child to see the list grow and we hope they will be proud of the books they have read over the summer months. Please have your student keep this log, be sure that their name is on it, and bring it to class on the first day of school. We don't want you to worry too much about how many books are on the log and we certainly don't need you to record every single book you read, but we suggest logging at least five books per week throughout the summer. Hopefully this log will be a source of pride for your student at the end of the summer!
